Extra funding of Capital Grant for 2012/13 to support local authority expenditure on Disabled Facilities Grant – Grant Determination 2012/13: No 2 [31/2095].

1. I am writing to inform you that Ministers have approved a one-off additional payment of £40million in funding for the Disabled Facilities Grant funding for 2012/13.

Principal features of the arrangements are as follows:

- Total grant payments made in the year 2012/13 to your authority under this grant determination will be limited to the amount set out in attached Grant Determination 2012/13: No 2 [31/2095].
 - The capital grant will be paid in one instalment on 12th December 2012.
 - Details of the amount awarded to each authority are in the attached grant determination letter.
2. The arrangements for supporting your local authority expenditure on Disabled Facilities Grant are as set out in the Grant Determination 2012/2013: No 2 [31/2095]. The additional funding will not be ring-fenced. A copy of this determination made under section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003 is attached. The payment will be made in one instalment through the LOGASnet system.
 3. This additional funding has been allocated to local authorities using a relative needs weighted index and all local authorities will receive some additional funding.
 4. I would be grateful if you could please pass on additional copies of this letter, and the determination for your Director of Housing and the Chief Officer responsible for administering the Disabled Facilities Grant at your local authority.

DISABLED FACILITIES CAPITAL (No.2) GRANT DETERMINATION 2012/13 [31/2095]

The Minister of State for Housing and Local Government (“the Minister”) in exercise of the powers conferred by section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003 hereby makes the following determination:-

Citation

- 1) This determination may be cited as the Disabled Facilities Capital (No.2) Grant Determination 2012/13 [31/2095].

Purpose of the grant

- 2) The purpose of the grant is to provide support to local authorities in England towards expenditure lawfully incurred or to be incurred by them.

Determination

- 3) The Minister determines, as the authorities to which grant is to be paid and the amount of grant to be paid, the authorities and the amounts set out in Annex B.

Grant conditions

- 4) Pursuant to section 31(4) of the Local Government Act 2003, the Minister of State determines that the grant will be paid subject to the conditions set out in Annex A to this determination.

Treasury consent

- 5) Before making this determination in relation to local authorities in England, the Minister obtained the consent of the Treasury

Grant Conditions

1. In this Annex -

“capital grant”, in relation to an authority, means the amount of grant identified as capital grant in relation to the authority in Annex B; and

“financial year” means a period of twelve months beginning with 1st April.

2. Capital grant paid to an authority under this determination may be used only for the purposes that a capital receipt may be used for in accordance with regulations made under section 11 of the Local Government Act 2003.
3. In relation to the financial year beginning on 1st April 2012 and each subsequent financial year, the Chief Executive (or the acting Chief Executive) or the officer with responsibility for financial affairs under section 151 of the Local Government Act 1972 of each authority must sign and return to the Department a declaration in the following terms:

“To the best of our knowledge and belief, and having carried out appropriate investigations and checks, in our opinion, in all significant respects, the conditions attached to the Disabled Facilities Capital (No.2) Grant Determination 2012/13: 31/2095 (‘the grant determination’) have been complied with in relation to the financial year beginning on 1st April [*insert the relevant year*].

This declaration is made in respect the grant allocated to the authority under the grant determination (see annex 1)”.

4. A declaration under paragraph 3 must be received no later than 10th June following the financial year in relation to which the declaration is made.
5. Paragraph 3 does not apply in relation to an authority and a financial year if one or more declarations have already been made in accordance with that paragraph which taken together concern the whole of the authority’s capital grant.
6. If an authority fails to comply with any of the requirements in paragraphs 2 to 4, the Minister may-
 - a) reduce, suspend or withhold grant; or
 - b) by notification in writing to the authority, require the repayment of the whole or any part of the grant.
7. Any sum notified by the Minister under paragraph 6(b) shall immediately become repayable to the Department.
