Caroline from the team attended London's first ever Bangladeshi health inequalities summit on Tuesday 24 September 2024 organised by The London Bangladeshi Health Partnership (LBHP). It was hosted at Tower Hamlets Town Hall, where the LBHP brought together an interdisciplinary group of key health partners with Bangladeshi community organisations, of which BHA is a part of and representatives, with the aim to respond to the health priorities of underserved Bangladeshi communities in London and the health inequalities they face. Bashir from BHA, also a partner in the ABAJ research project, gave a presentation on the lived experiences of T2 diabetes in the Bangladeshi community.

Sheila attended the All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) meeting for Healthy Homes and Buildings Meeting of the Healthy Homes on Monday October 14th and joined the HousingLin HAPPI Hour's 100th webinar on Retrofitting Sheltered Housing on 15th October.

Neela's project, titled "The Making and Unmaking of Home," explores intergenerational family living, cultural dynamics, and evolving routines and spaces within the home. She is keen to develop new skills at MotH and focus on the practical outcomes of her research.

As the co-analysis of data continues with Faruk, Aminur, Bashir, Leena and the OU team, we are excited to announce that the next phase of our research is now in place, focusing on the experiences of Bangladeshi families living in "joint families" across the London boroughs of Newham, Redbridge, Hackney, and Tower Hamlets. To date, we have interviewed four families, with two more scheduled to participate, and we are aiming to reach a total of 10 families for this study. To support this, Tabaruq has also published a small news item in Bangla newspapers to encourage families to take part.
